Comprehension

1. Answer the following questions in a sentence each:

i) Why was Khagemba going to Delhi?

Ans: Khagemba went to Delhi to attend to some personal business.

ii) Who looked after the goods of Khagemba when he got off to have breakfast with the stranger?

Ans: A passenger in the compartment looked after his goods.

iii) What was the tall man's brother?

Ans: The tall man's brother was an Army officer.

iv) Why did Bina and Chandra go to Trichur?

Ans: Bina and Chandra went to Trichur for Bina's admission to a medical college at Trichur.

v) How did things become easy for Chandra at the medical college?

Ans: Things became easy with the help of Mr. Nair.
