Q1. What is a Hazard?

Ans:- Hazard is a dangerous natural or man-made condition that can cause injury, loose of life, damage to property or environment.

Q2. What is a disaster?

Ans:- Disaster is a natural or man-made event that kills a lot of people or damage to property and environment

Q3. What is vulnerability?

Ans:- Vulnerability is the extent to which a person or a community can be affected by natural disasters or man-made conditions.

Q4. What do you mean by risk?

Ans:- Risk is a measure of the potential to cause damage

Q5. Why is fire regarded as one of the socio-natural hazards?

Ans:- It is because, fire can be caused by both human activity as well as by lightning, which is a natural factor.
